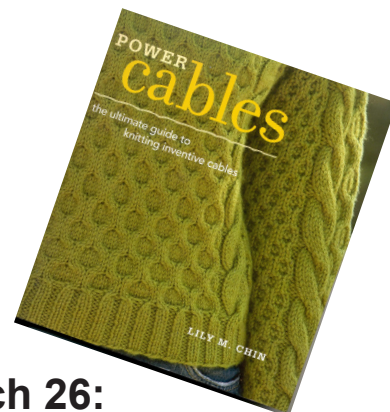

We are fortunate to have Lily Chin as our guest instructor for our March workshops. Lily will be teaching six 3-hour classes over three days - Friday, March 24, Saturday, March 25, and Sunday, March 26.



Lily Chin is an internationally famous knitter and crocheter who has worked in the yarn industry for more than 30 years as a designer, instructor, and author of 8 books on knitting and crochet.

What hasn't Lily done? She was named to the Crochet Hall of Fame in 2015, named a Master Knitter by Vogue Knitting, and has been involved in some aspect of the fashion industry since age 13. A New York City native, Lily has lived part-time in Los Angeles as well. She's designed for magazines and yarn companies since 1982. She's worked for designers from Ralph Lauren to Diane von Furstenberg, from Isaac Mizrahi to Vera Wang. Her work has been on the backs of supermodels and celebrities.

Lily was officially made fastest crocheter in the world in the 2002 international competition. She has authored books on knitting and crochet since 1999 and has online classes and several DVD's. She writes articles and has been teaching since 1989. Her workshops, lectures and seminars in hand and machine knitting and crochet are conducted worldwide. She's even had her own line of yarns and patterns from 2005-2008.

Lily has made over hundreds of appearances on television and in print media, from the Late Show with David Letterman to CNN, from the NY Times to the Washington Post. She is most proud of her teaching skills, using state-of-the-art tech equipment in class so that all can see.

Friday, March 24:

Reversible Cables

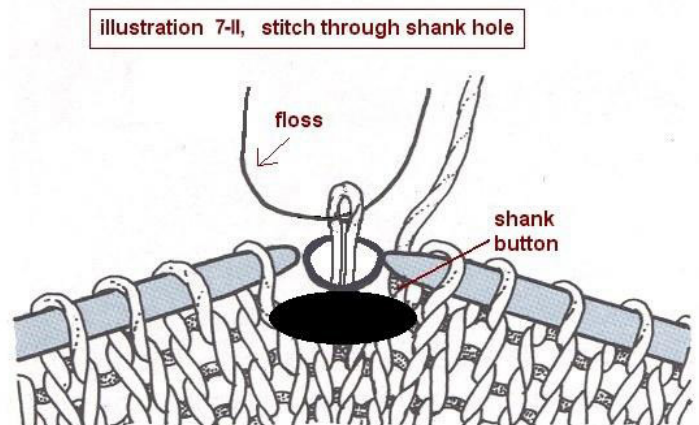
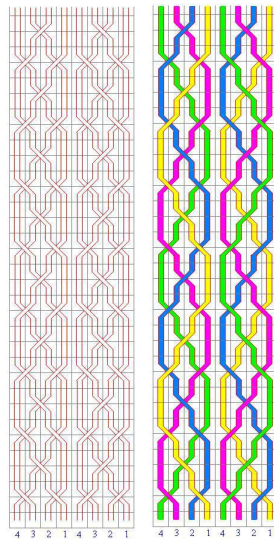
Proficiency Level: At least advanced-beginner, anyone who's tried their hand at some kind of cable.

Description: Simple to execute, cables are almost always worked over stockinette stitch thereby producing a “wrong” side. This is not particularly attractive on a scarf or shawl or afghan where the “wrong side” will be in full view of the public. In this class, learn how cables work, which stitches, yarns and needles are ideal for these reversible cables, and how to chart them so you'll know what you'll be getting beforehand. By the end of this class, you will have a sampler of reversible cables plus enough ideas to keep you in stitches for a long, long time.

Designing and Charting your own Original Cables

Proficiency Level: Intermediate Must be comfortable reading knitting symbols or reading stitch charts. Must have worked several cables before.

Description: You've done many cables before and want to get into more complex cable patterns. Maybe you want to design your own cables. Learn how cable patterns are actually formed, what are the basic traits and characteristics and manipulations? When you get a better understanding of how cable patterns work, not only can you follow the directions a whole lot better, fewer mistakes are made. You may even look at a cable pattern and figure out how to work it even without verbal directions!



Saturday, March 25:

Tips, Tricks and Hints

Proficiency Level: Advanced-Beginner

Description: Learn all the little secrets to make knitting life easier and better. Find out how to cast on in 2-tail method without running out of the second tail. Join a new skein of yarn or a new color without losing that first stitch. See ways of attaching buttons as you work. Create invisible circular bind offs on a neck where the beginning and end are absolutely imperceptible. Weave in those little ends that are too short to put through a darning needle. Take away lots of small “fix-its” and improve those details.

Saturday, March 25:

Knocking Off a Garment

Proficiency Level: Intermediate – Must have made garments before.

Description: Have a ready-to-wear garment that you love? Does this garment fit you like a glove? Would you like to interpret it as a handknit or hand-crochet? See how to copy this garment and create a pattern from the original. Learn how easy it is to translate it as a knit (or crochet) without even doing much math!

Sunday, March 26:

Reversible Knit Purl Color Combinations

Proficiency Level: Intermediate, must be able to follow charts with ease.

Description: How often have you made scarves or shawls or afghans, wishing the “other side” was just as presentable? Always intrigued by reversibility, Lily will present some colorwork into these items and many others. Covered will be several knit-purl combinations.

Borderline Personalities - Keeping “Trim”

Proficiency Level: Advanced Beginner - Intermediate

Description: Tired of the same old ribbing at your garment bottoms? Want a sweater that hangs straight instead of puckering at the lower edges? Learn some different trims (some applied afterwards). Use these not just at the garment bottoms but around necklines, sleeves, open cardigan fronts, even skirt waistbands.
